Happy summer holidays! To prepare your child for Reception, below are some suggestions of activities/topics to practice over the holidays.



## **Activity Ideas**

1. Learn and practice Phase 2 Phonic sounds, using Jolly Phonic songs (YouTube - <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IznOX4dhJys">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IznOX4dhJys</a>). Think of things that begin with each initial sound (s – sun, sock, sand, a – apple, ant, astronaut, t – tin, table etc.)



• If you would like to challenge your child, use Phase 2 phonic sounds to make CV/CVC word OR simple CV/CVC sentences – for example: it is a big cat, the dog can sit.

2. Print the blank number line below and use it to support counting, number ordering, 1-1 correspondence (counting amounts, matching numbers to amounts etc.) and counting on from a given number.

- 3. Practice recognising, naming and identifying properties of 2D shapes (corners and sides) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WTeqUejf3D0
- To challenge children introduce more complex 2D shapes pentagon, hexagon and octagon.
- 4. Encourage your child to practice <u>dressing</u> and <u>undressing</u> independently especially with socks and tights. Once a week get your child to practice putting their school uniform on as this will help when they start PE lessons and have to get changed independently.
- 5. Ensure your child is independently using the toilet for both a wee and a poo. As they will be in school <u>all day</u> we want the children to know where and how to go to the toilet. Children should be dry at night as well.
- 6. Go out and explore throughout the holidays. Take your children to different places and on public transport and encourage them to talk about where they have been, what they did / enjoyed. You could even support them with drawing a picture of their favourite memories over the holidays.

- 8. Talk to your child nearing the end of the summer holiday about their new teacher, new classroom and new school to support their transition and so children can be prepared for their new adventure!
