








Science

All living things

Pupils should be taught to:





-Explain the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird -Describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals (including humans)



Animals, including humans

Pupils should be taught to:

-describe the changes as humans . develop from birth to old age (including puberty) .



PSHE and Citizenship

Pupils should be taught:

- -About how the body changes during puberty
- *-To recognise different types of relationship including marriage/civil partnership and those between friends and families
- -To understand personal boundaries; to identify what they are willing to share with their most special people; friends; classmates and others; and that we all have rights to privacy .
- To know that there are some cultural practices which are against British law and universal human-rights, such as female genital mutilation (FGM)
- -To deepen their understanding of good and not so good feelings
- -Personal hygiene and self care regimes
- -To understand how their actions effect themselves and others

PSHE and Citizenship


Pupils should:

 - * Many children are already going through puberty. This learning will support those already going through changes that are happening to their bodies, and prepare those who are yet to begin.






Changes that happen to humans as they approach old age Life cycle of a human from baby to senior citizen.




